Falls City, 16-9 a season ago, returns four starters - seniors Cord Huettner (6-2 forward) and Wade Witt (6-2 forward), junior Mitchell Harling (6-0 guard) and sophomore Jordy Stoller (5-11 guard) - as well as senior Mitchell Campbell (6-2 forward) and juniors Reese Hogue (6-3 forward) and Tyler DiGiacomo (6-0 guard), who all played quality minutes a season ago. Sophomore newcomer Jack Hartman (6-3 guard/forward) saw his varsity minutes increase towards the end of last season and will take a big step forward

this year. His athleticism and versatility were on full display during the football season and will make it hard for Hogue to keep him off the court. It wouldn't be a shocker to see him quickly become a starter.

"Campbell, DiGiacomo and Hartman will all be a huge part of our rotation and had great summers," Coach Hogue said.

Harling, a two-year starter, averaged 8.5 points and just over two assists per game last season, but struggled with consistency

Outlook: The Tigers are primed for another solid season and should look to better their win total from a year ago. An added year of experience for two-year starter Mitchell Harling and sophomore Jordy Stoller should help solidify the Tiger backcourt. In the front court will be Wade Witt and hopefully a healthy Cord Huettner, both seniors. Also watch for Reese Hogue, Mitchell Campbell Tyler DiGiacomo and Jack Hartman to get quality minutes in the rotation. Falls City will again lean on great effort to win ball games, but look for this team to be more of a threat offensively when compared to Hogue's past couple of teams. from the floor at times. The young man is the glue of this team and if he can get it going offensively while also keeping others involved on the offensive end, the sky's the limit for the Tigers.

"Mitchell is our floor general," Coach Hogue said. "He is a scorer and can and will need to score for us."

One thing about Harling is he might be a better defender. He possesses great foot work and despite having only 40 steals a season ago, he took a team-high 20 charges while committing less than three fouls per game.

Complimenting Harling in the backcourt will be Stoller, who averaged 5.1 ppg a season ago, but was second on the team in 3-point percentage. Stoller's brother Josh graduated last May and with that went 10.5 ppg as well as a 37.4 3-point percentage, so Jordy should look to fill the void left by his brother.

Down low for the Tigers will be Huettner and Wade Witt. Witt averaged 7.2 ppg and was second to Huettner in rebounding. The lefty led the team in field goal percentage (51.1) last season and is a tough matchup for opposing bigs down low because of his deceptive quickness.

Questions remain about Huettner, the leading scorer and rebounder last winter, because of a back injury suffered in the playoff loss to Boys Town in football back on October 25.

Huettner, who averaged 13 ppg and 6 rpg last year, was slated to return to practice Monday, but his availability for the start of the season is still up in the air as Hogue wasn't sure about Huettner's legs being under him just yet.

With all the falls and spills associated with basketball these days, the biggest uncertainty for the 2012-13 Tiger basketball season and the young man's future athletic plans will be that lower back. If it has had enough time to heal, then it should be smooth sailing, but if the pain lingers it could make for a long winter for Huettner. If I were betting though, knowing this guy's toughness, I'd go with the former as opposed to the latter.

"Cord and Wade are guys that started and played as sophomores," Coach Hogue said. "They both bring physical play and scoring for us. Two different styles, but effective."

Junior post player Reese Hogue added a couple inches to his frame and will provide quality minutes, especially on the glass and the defensive end.

"These three will play a huge part on the boards and defending typically bigger posts," Hogue added.

Hogue's team will again rely on playing stingy defense. Opponents averaged just 43 points a game last year and over the past 5-6 seasons they are scoring right around the 40 ppg mark. The philosophy is to cause chaos for 32 minutes, all 84-feet and turn the other team's turnovers in to points for the Tigers.

This defensive approach requires a lot out of the players physically, so the added depth this season should increase the effort on the floor, not that it was a problem a season ago, but the young players are a year older.

"I feel we have the tools in the toolbox to get the job done," Hogue said. "We have to find our roles on the team, which is playing together, playing hard and playing smart. We gotta play every game thinking it is our last."

A bit of a youth movement is in sure for the Falls City High Lady Tiger basketball program as only three players with ample varsity experience return for the 2012-13 team.

Seniors Claire Poppe and Tressa Chandler and junior Brooke Scheitel contributed mightily last season, but after that trio plenty of fresh faces will need to step in to fill


the void left by Ashleigh Jordening, Ashley Sickel and Jacy Lewis.

Jordening did just about everything a year ago for the Lady Tigers, leading her team in scoring (10.54 ppg), while also being at the top of just about every other statistical category.

Poppe will be one of, if not the best athlete on the court any given night. The senior guard averaged 8.46 points per game and led the team in assists (72) and steals (42)

Chandler is a tad undersized for a post player at 5 feet 8 inches, but she possesses a knack for the ball and rarely has a problem grabbing rebounds or loose balls. Chandler will have to repeat or maybe even

last season. Her quickness and aggressiveness should cause a lot of problems for opposing guards and she is versatile enough to cover forwards down low.

"We will be young at some positions," said Coach Milam. "Leadership from our juniors and seniors will be important early in the season."



"I really think we have a legit shot at qualifying at 113, 120, 126, 152 and 170," Windle said.

Coach Windle had this season circled as maybe his last with the Tiger wrestling program, but is having second thoughts and might stick around.

"I haven't decided yet," Windle said with that uniquely recognizable smile on his face. "My assistants (Keith Gilkerson, Troy Nelson and Ernie Valentine) want me to stick around, so we'll just see how it all goes."

Well, you can be assured that those young men strapping on the head gear will do everything in their power to persuade Coach Windle to stick around.



## Irish possess ingredients for repeat trip to Lincoln

A good recipe for success on the basketball court calls for great guard play at both ends, quality post players who can score, rebound and defend, a good amount of athleticism and a high basketball

Well, the 2012-13 Falls City Sacred Heart boys' basketball team could be the grocery list.

Irish Head Coach Doug Goltz returns for his 26th season just two wins shy of 500 career victories. On his way to the milestone, Goltz has

> led FCSH to 12 statetournaments, won eight state championships and posted a ridiculous 30-4 record in Lincoln. But as much of an achievement 500 will be, a deep run in the

state tournament this season holds higher priority.

The Irish return four starters from a season ago and in essence return five with senior Lane Barnhill back in the lineup after missing the entire 2011-12 season with a knee injury.

Barnhill rejoins seniors Clay Finck and Brady Cromer and juniors Chaz Dunn and Matt Goltz in the starting lineup, one that will cause opposing defenses plenty of problems.

Goltz averaged 10.3 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season and was a 2<sup>nd</sup> team All-State selection by the Lincoln Journal Star in Class D2. The 6-foot-2 forward

Outlook: Head Coach Doug Goltz enters his 26th season for the Irish and is just two wins shy of 500 wins, another historic milestone by a coach that has accomplished just about everything. That win should come quickly for Coach Goltz whose team returns four starters from a year ago, as well as senior Lane Barnhill who missed the 2011-12 season with a knee injury. Barnhill averaged 9.2 points per game two years ago as a sophomore and should pick up right where he left off. In the backcourt with Barnhill are returning starters Clay Finck and Chaz Dunn who will make the Irish backcourt one of the best in Class D2. Matt Goltz, who is a threat inside and out, should have a breakout year. Brady Cromer joins Goltz in the front court and averaged 7.5 ppg last year. The Irish will play a tough schedule, but rest assured, they'll be a force to be reckoned with come March

6-4, 235 pounds and will need to grab a big share of the rebounds. His scoring may take a hit with Barnhill back in the lineup, but he is a vital part of where this team is looking to be at the end of the season.

Dunn is a slasher who took over games at times last season and should be the third major scoring threat with Barnhill and Goltz. Any one of those three could light it up on any given night and the Irish will be tough if all three score consistently night in and night out. Dunn played a big role last season with Barnhill out and dished out a team-high 82 assists, while turning it over only 48 times. Dunn and Barnhill playing together will be fun to watch.

Finck will again handle the point for Coach Goltz and should increase his assist total from a season ago (65), especially given the fact that the Irish will undoubtedly increase their points-pergame average from a season ago (45.3). Expect to see the Irish look to push the ball a little more and bump that average to the mid-50 range. Much is asked of the point guard in Coach Goltz' offense and Finck has been running the show since he was a sophomore, so look for his best season yet as a distributor.

Others in the mix will be senior Lane Scheitel (6-0 guard) and juniors Colin Niemeyer (6-0 guard), Jarod Fiegener (6-0 forward) and Sean Strasheim (6-2 forward). All are quality role players who will make plenty more plays than mistakes. Niemeyer averaged almost 4 ppg last year and Fiegener is a wide body down low who will use his frame to grab rebounds. All four will add quality minutes defensively.

Last season, the Irish struggled to score at times, but with Barnhill, Dunn and Goltz all poised to put up good numbers on the offensive end, scoring droughts should be few and far between.

Defensively, the Irish will get apply plenty of pressure whether it be in a zone or man-to-man. Their athleticism and quickness will make either brand of defense easy to execute and having the benefit of solid depth should allow them to put plenty of full-court pressure on teams in hopes of creating more easy buckets.

Perennial nemesis Sterling is again in the Irish's subdistrict and defeated Sacred Heart in two of their three meetings last year, but the one loss came when it mattered most – in the subdistrict final. The Irish defeated the Jets 58-44 last February to advance to the district final.

Rounding out the D2-1 sub are Lewiston (7-13 last year) and Parkview Christian (14-8), so a rematch of last year's sub final is expected. On the other side of the district are Deshler (17-8 in D1), Dorchester (1-20), Meridian (6-18) and Nebraska Lutheran (3-16). The Irish's sub is without a doubt tougher than the other side, so a trip to Lincoln will most likely be won by advancing through the subdistrict.

With a stable of guards any team would be envious of and experienced post players, the Irish should flirt with 20 wins. Coach Goltz always has teams playing better in late-February than during the early part of the season, so look for this team to be peaking at the right time and reach their second-straight trip to Lincoln.

# Young, guard-oriented Lady Irish in 2012-13

The words "guard-oriented" haven't been tossed around lately when talking about the Falls City Sacred Heart Lady Irish basketball team, but the transition from 2012 graduate Sara Landis is well underway.

Landis accounted for one-third of her team's points last season by averaging 16.7 per game, while also pulling down 13 rebounds a game. She was also third on the team in steals and swatted 65 shots.

Yes, she is not a player who comes along often, nor is she someone you replace.

But that's precisely what FCSH Head Coach Luke Santo has in mind with the new approach.

"We don't have have the size we had in the past, so we will be more guard-oriented," Santo said. "We should be hard to guard if we can spread teams out."

Junior Ashli Jordan, a two-year starter, is the seasonedvet of the backcourt, but will need to move into more of a scoring role after averaging just under five points per game last season.

"Ashli will need to be more aggressive on the offensive end," Santo said. "Last year she averaged 4.9 points per game. We need her to double that."

Jordan will be joined in the backcourt by sophomore twins Abby and Elizabeth Magdanz. Abby will most likely run the point while Elizabeth is more of a scoring threat. The duo combined for 17 ppg and 175 assists for the season and will need to pickup some of the scoring load this season.

Inside will be junior Emma "The Enforcer" Schock, who is a little undersized at 5 feet 8 inches tall, but Santo is confident she will work hard and battle inside. 


Three seniors will look to lead a pack of underclassmen, highlighted by five freshmen, this winter for the Humboldt-TR-S Titan basketball




