After posting back-to-back 3-6 seasons in 2018 and 2019, the Falls City Tiger football team took a big step forward in 2020, finishing the year at 5-4. In mid-September, the Tigers put together a three-game winning streak, including a 55-0 drubbing of Fairbury. Unfortunately, the Tigers lost three of their final four games and missed the postseason.

Head Coach Darin Fritz enters his tenth season as the signal-caller for the Tigers and boasts a 46-30 record at FC.

Falls City has a lot of experience coming back this season. Coach Fritz welcomes back 20 letter winners from last season, including six starters on offense and five on defense. The Tigers once again will run the single wing on the offensive side of the ball and will run a base 4-3 defense. The Tigers will need a few of the younger players to step up on both sides of the ball to be successful. Falls City last made the playoffs in 2015 when they finished 7-3, falling to Norfolk Catholic, 42-0 in the opening round of the Class C1 playoffs.

Coach Fritz will lean heavily on his senior class for leadership. Jaden Nolte, a 6'5 285lb senior, will anchor both the offensive and defensive line. Nolte, a four-year starter, has All-State capabilities. Shoring up the line along with Nolte will be senior Thomas Fields. Fields, a 6'2 220 lineman, was the leading tackler from last season's squad. Fields also led the team in sacks and tackles for losses. Fields also excels in the classroom as he is a 4.0 student. Another athlete back for his senior season is Carson Simon. Carson, a 6'0 200lb running back and linebacker, was the leading rusher for Falls City last season with 724 yards and passed for another 310. Also, look for senior Rayce Farmer, a 5'10 165 cornerback, to add depth to the defense. Last season, Farmer led the Tiger in interceptions. Justin Brewer, a 6'0 235lb lineman, has lettered twice and had been a very consistent player for Coach Fritz. Look for 6'3 255lb Wade Wasson and 5'9 235lb Dalton Helmick to give the Tigers valuable minutes on the field this fall.

"We lost a good group of seniors from last season," said Fritz. "I think we have good, dedicated, young players to fill in for all of those positions, however. We return all of our offensive line and our leading rusher and passer from last season. Defensively we return most of our defensive line and a lot of experience in the defensive backfield. The goal is to build on last season and be a more competitive football team. With the size and experience we have returning; I am expecting this group to be very competitive.



Expect to see Steiphan Fields, Jon Craig, Kellen McAfee, Wyatt Olberding, Kadyn Strecker, Cam Schramm, Jaxyn Strauss, Charlie McNeely and Daniel Hollens on the field this fall.

The Tigers will open the 2021 season on the road at Platteview on August 27th. Last year Falls City defeated the Trojans 28-18 to kick off the 2020 campaign.

IRISH FOOTBALL LOOKS TO GET BACK TO THE TOP OF CLASS D2

The Falls City Sacred Heart football program has gotten close the past two seasons, falling in the semifinals both years, first to Humphrey St. Francis in 2019 and then last year to runner-up Sandhill-Thedford.

Head Coach Doug Goltz will be entering his 34th season as coach of the Irish, compiling an astounding 327-56 record. In his 34 years, the Irish have won eight state titles and put together an 87-game winning streak in the '80s and '90s. Back on the sideline helping Goltz this fall are Luke Santo, Brian Lemerond and Garrett Harring.

Sacred Heart will return 15 letter winners from a season ago but will miss the three seniors from last year's squad.

All three players were All-State starters, Del Casteel, Jack Fiegener and Kyle Bauman.

"Del Casteel's contributions will be difficult to replace," said Goltz. "If we have a good summer, stay healthy and have a few other guys step up, we could be one of the better D2 teams."

Casteel was the leading tackler and rusher last year, Fiegener was the top receiver and Bauman was the guy that kept the team together. Casteel rushed for 758 yards and 23 touchdowns and made 137 tackles on defense. Fiegener caught 34 balls for 803 yards and 13 TD's and Bauman had 37 tackles, including eight sacks.

The Irish will bring back five starters on both sides of the ball and will look to attack teams with a multi-look offense and a 3-3 defense.

Goltz will look for seniors Brogan Nachtigal, Jakob Jordan, Tyler Catlin and Derek Schawang to lead the way. Nachtigal, a 6'3, 215lb specimen, will anchor the line on both sides of the ball but may see some time at linebacker as well. Jordan, a dual-threat QB, will also see the field on defense as a defensive back. Catlin will see action as a fullback and linebacker and Schawang will play on the offensive and defensive lines. Nachtigal finished last season with 96 tackles, including four sacks. Jordan got in on 40 stops and had five interceptions to go along, with 697 yards rushing and 1579 passing yards. The Irish outrushed opponents 2144-1484 last year and had a 1754-1120 advantage through the air.

Coach Goltz will also look to Evan Keithley, Jake Froeschl and Sam Dunn to provide big minutes for the Irish. Keithley started a few games a season ago for SH and proved to be one of the best punters in Class D2. Froeschl, an end and defensive back, is a very athletic and explosive player on the field


and Dunn, a junior, will split time at end on offense and defensive back on the other side of the ball.

Goltz said to also look for Zachary Keithley, Peyton Doerr, Nicholas Keithley, Will Ewers, Matthew Neddenriep and Joe Simon to see significant action this season.

"We have to replace three very good, graduated seniors," said Goltz. We return several good players. We have a big senior class which will make us a mature team."

Sacred Heart will travel to defending Class D2 State Champion BDS on Friday, September 10. The Irish will open their season at home against Nebraska City Lourdes on Friday, August 27, at 7:00 p.m.

After a rough 2020 season, the HTRS Titans are looking to get off on the right track in 2021. The Titans lost three starters last season in the opening three games and failed to rebound, finishing the campaign at 0-7. The Titans had one game versus Palmyra that was canceled due to COVID.

Head Coach Caleb Lempka, a 2014 Peru St. grad, will be entering his third season at the helm of the Titan program. Lempka's teams are 2-13 over his first two years but look for a marked improvement this season. Assisting Lempka on the sidelines this fall will be Kolton Taiclet and Grant Tuttle.

A large senior class will be looked upon to lead the Titans on the field this fall. Gone from last year's team are Jayden McNealy and Donovan Kostecka; both will be hard to replace. However, returning for Coach Lempka are seniors Aiden Worthey, Nic Knudson and Hunter Frey. According to Coach Lempka, Worthey, 5'9, 185lbs, will be a leader on the defensive side of the ball and the best overall player. Worthey has a nose for the ball and loves contact. Last season, in only five games, Worthey carried the ball 42 times for 370 yards and three TD's and made 84 tackles on defense. Worthey will take the field as the Titans fullback and middle linebacker.

Nic Knudson, a 6'0, 135lb senior, will fill the role of end and safety. Knudson played just two games last season due to injury but still led the Titans with nine catches for 204 yards and four touchdowns. Knudson is the best cover man for Coach Lempka and will likely return punts and kicks. Senior Hunter Frey, a 5'11 140lb end and defensive end, will look to provide high energy to HTRS. Frey flies to the ball and doesn't shy away from contact. Frey was the Titan's second-leading tackler last season (77 total stops) and is one of the better blocking ends on the team. This season, the Titans will also depend on senior Andy Stalder, a 6'0 210lb lineman and Ryken Davis, a 6'0, 230lb junior lineman.

The Titans return most of their team from a season ago; however, they will need to fill the quarterback and running back positions on offense. HTRS returns most of the linemen from last season on both sides of the ball, so they should supply plenty of experience upfront. The Titans will return five starters on the offensive side of the ball and bring back six on defense. Coach Lempka will employ the 3-3 on defense and the offense will be running the wishbone.

"Goals for this season are to improve on the little things and become more consistent across the board," said Coach Lempka. "We beat ourselves in many of the games last year with turnovers and blown assignments. Want to be more aggressive and be able to control the ball with our running game and hope to wear people down with our running attack."

HTRS kicks off the 2021 campaign on Friday, August 27, with a home contest against Southern. Last season the Titans fell to Southern 44-20 in the season-opener. If the Titans can stay healthy and get off to a quick start this season, they could become a threat to many teams in the area.

The torch has officially been passed on the Tiger softball field. After 20 years as the skipper of the Tiger softball program, Coach Joe Dunn has stepped down and Head Coach Trista Hutchings takes over. Hutchings, a co-head coach last season, enters year two with the Falls City program. Last season, FC finished the season with five wins against 23 losses, down from the 13-14 record in 2019. Assisting Coach Hutchings this season are Haley Ruiz (2nd year), Maggie Nelson (1st year) and Tayten O'Brien (1st year). The Lady Tigers will welcome back eight letter winners from a season ago and look to improve on the five wins from the 2020 campaign.

"The goal is to improve our record from last year, love playing the game and build team cohesion," said Hutchings. "Don't aspire to be the best on the team; aspire to be the best for the team."

Returning starters include senior infielder Brylee Gilkerson, senior infielder Madi Scholl and senior outfielder Courtney McClintock. Juniors back for another season are pitcher Kacy Brewer, catcher Madi Jones, utility Elyse Poppe, outfielder Hannah Collier, infielder Christina Gilkerson, infielder Chelssa Sells and outfielder Mataya Wilcox. Sophomores include infielder Havyn Ruiz and infielder Emily Vitosh. Jordan Wilcox, Izzy Armbruster, Emilou Schulenberg, Kaitlyn Titus, and Gabby Furrow will add depth to the team.

Falls City will miss Thayer Armbruster (.286 avg., 2HR, 12RBI), Abby Harms (.244 avg. 9 runs scored), Shaylee Dunlop and Sara Black (.365 avg., 7RBI, 12 runs scored).

Offensively, Coach Hutchings will look for some batters from last season to step up and for everyone to play heads-up softball.

"We are looking to improve our offensive team mentality," said Hutchings.

Defensively, the Lady Tigers will be called upon to play hard, do their best and leave everything on the field. Coach Hutchings stressed maximum efforts on every play.

The Tigers will look forward to playing Nebraska City again this season and Waverly, their first home game of the season, on Monday, August 23. The Lady Tigers will host parent's night on September 21 against the Fairbury Jeffs and as usual, the Tigers look forward to competing against the Auburn Bulldogs.

With a bit of luck and hard work, Falls City will be looking to return to the State Tournament for the first time since the 2006 season.

The Falls City Tiger Cross Country teams are ready to navigate any course that can be thrown at them. Falls City will have 12 high school boys, eight high school girls and five junior high athletes competing this fall.

Gone from last year's squad are Brenna Leyden, Jared Hawley, Eli Bottom, Will Vitosh, Brock Hogue and Riley Kobza. Hawley was a two-time State Meet qualifier and Bottom finished in 57th place at last year's State Meet held at the Kearney Country Club.

In his 22nd year as the Head Coach of the Tigers cross country team, Coach Cody Hawley will have three senior boys to help lead the way, Ray Feek, Pressler Bruxellas and Carson Bredemeier. Senior girls providing leadership will be Nia Crawford and Emmy Lu Feek.

"Our district still has not been set for this fall," said Hawley. "We are ready to compete at a high level against wherever the NSAA sends us for districts."

Falls City, looking to end the drought, has not sent a girl's team to State since 1984 and the boys haven't qualified as a team since 1995. Over the past 22 seasons, since Hawley took the program over, 24 athletes have individually qualified for the State Cross Country Meet.

"We lost our top two boys runners and three senior leaders from last year's team," said Hawley. "The boys' team will be led by Joe Vrtiska, Alex McKim, Bryson Butrick, Ray Feek and newcomer Blake Rolfe. We are looking for the whole boy's team to make a big leap forward so the Tigers can continue to achieve high team places at every meet. There will be a nice battle with the boys' team to compete at the Varsity level each week."



Coach Hawley and assistant Coach Amanda Merz (sixth season) will look to change the training schedule a little this fall.


"The first week was definitely a challenge and the kids adapted well to the change and excessive heat," said Hawley. "We also added more hill running and implementing Hopi runs."


Falls City has a strong chance of sending multiple athletes to the State Meet in October if the runners hold themselves accountable and give each workout their fullest effort.



TIGER VOLLEYBALL LOOKING TO TAKE NEXT STEP

The Falls City Tiger volleyball team is looking to build off of last season's record of 12-16. In early October last year, the Tigers had a season-best four-game winning streak and won two of three matches against rival Auburn. Unfortunately for Falls City, the Bulldogs swept FC in three sets in subdistricts last fall to end the season.

Head Coach Allison Haines enters her third season as the play-caller for Falls City. In her first two seasons, Haines has a combined record of 21-37. Assisting Haines this fall will be fourth-year coach Maygan Ramsey and Terri Hogue, who is in her third season as an assistant.

The Tigers have a solid group coming back with eight letter winners taking the court for Coach Haines. Returning for Falls City will be seniors Chase Nolte (middle blocker), Josie Riggs (outside hitter) and Lindsey McNeely (defensive specialist). Juniors returning are RaeAnn Thompson (middle blocker) and Reece McNeely (outside hitter). Sophomores back this fall are Ashleigh Kirkendall (setter/opposite), Lexi Brewer (libero/outside hitter), Makinley Scholl (setter/opposite) and Nevada West (opposite hitter). 

The HTRS Titan volleyball is looking to improve upon its 2020 campaign. The Lady Titans finished with an impressive 20-11 final record, seeing their season end at the hands of the Johnson-Brock Eagles in three sets in subdistrict play. The Titans put together impressive five-game winning streaks twice last season, including the first five of the season.

Head Coach Kara Engles looks to add to her win total at HTRS. In 18 seasons, Engles sports a 300-216 record. Assisting Coach Engles this season will be Nic Sikora and Brittany Rogers.

Also, look for Jaylie McNealy, a 5'6 sophomore, Hannah Koziol, a 5'6 sophomore, Macy Vritska, a 5'10 freshman, and Laramie Glathar, 5'8 freshman, to contribute to the Titans success this fall on the court.

Offensively, the Titans will have some excellent hitters; the problem could lie with getting them the ball.

"We have been working really hard on passing and ball handling," said Coach Engles. "So hopefully, our offense will start to improve." Defensively the Titans will have to be strong to run any kind of productive offense.




Defensively, the Irish will look to be solid again and disciplined at all times.






