YOUNG TIGERS HOPING TO BUILD ON LAST SEASON

Coach Don Hogue enters his 23rd season as the play-caller for the Tigers basketball team. Hogue will be looking to replace four starters and six letter winners from last year's 9-13 squad. Not all is lost, as FC lost six different contests by five or fewer points and had a junior varsity team that finished 11-1. Falls City's season came to a close last season in sub-districts at the hands of Syracuse, 48-34

Hogue, in search of his 300th win, currently is 290-239 at Falls City.

The Tigers will rely on two returning starters in Carson Bredemeier and Jaxyn Strauss. Bredemeier, a 6'1 guard, averaged 11 points per game, making a team-record 66 three-pointers last season, while Strauss, a 6'3 guard/forward had 84 points and 72 rebounds.

Coach Hogue will look to speed up the game while continuing to be solid on the defensive end of the court. To be successful this winter, the Tigers will need to take care of the ball on offense while hitting the boards hard on both ends of the court.

Hogue will also look to his bench for quality minutes. Seniors Rayce Farmer, 6'0 guard and Kyle Eickhoff, a 6'2 forward, will have to help fill spots on the court. Juniors Jon Craig, 6'3 center, Bryson Butrick, 6'0 guard, Joe Vrtiska, 6'0 guard and Alijah Hernandez, 6'0 guard, will all be called upon for minutes this winter.


According to Coach Hogue, they will be testing the waters a little at the point position as Butrick had a solid summer. Bredemeier has the shooting guard position locked up after hitting 66 treys last season. Farmer & Strauss can fire the rock as well.

Strauss will do most of his damage from the forward position, where the 6'3 versatile athlete will be able to get to the rim. Look for Eickhoff to make some noise at the forward position as well. According to Hogue, Eickhoff has a knack for getting to loose balls around the hoop.

The man in the middle appears to be Craig. Jon can find the bottom of the net from the post and has above-average moves for a big man. Craig's footwork improved over the summer, as did his shooting from the charity stripe.

Falls City will miss Will Vitosh (13 points per game), Brock Hogue (team record 132 assists) and Tyler Uhri (81 points and 125 rebounds.) The Tigers will be out for revenge as they open the season on the road at Syracuse on Friday, December 3, at 7:30 p.m.

IRISH HAVE SIGHTS SET ON A THREE-PEAT

The Falls City Sacred Heart Irish boy's basketball team will be gunning for their third consecutive Class D2 state championship this season. Last year, the Irish (20-7) pulled off the improbable, entering the tourney at the seven seed and taking down the #2, #3 and #4 seed to win the program's 11th state title. In mid-January, the Irish had lost four in a row and the postseason was looking bleak. After losing the Pioneer Conference tourney championship to Tri County, the Irish finished the year with eight straight wins to secure their back-to-back titles.

It's worth noting that Head Coach Doug Goltz tied the Nebraska boy's all-time win total in the title game last season. Goltz enters the season with a 694-183 record with the Irish, tied with Doug Mendlik of Wisner-Pilger.

Sacred Heart graduated Jack Fiegener, Del Casteel and Kyle Bauman but will return four of the five starters from last year's squad. Fiegener averaged 14 points and eight rebounds per game. Casteel added one point and two boards per game and Bauman scored three points and pulled in four rebounds per contest.

Jakob Jordan, eight points, 117 assists and 52 steals will operate the point for the Irish. Jake Froeschl, seven points, 46 steals and 59 assists, will join Jordan in the backcourt. Evan Keithley, five points, three rebounds and 29 steals and Brogan Nachtigal, ten points, six boards and 38 assists will be back in the frontcourt for Coach Goltz. Look for sophomore Joe Simon to fill in the fifth position this winter for the Irish. Simon saw his playing time go up as the season progressed last year and was a significant contributor at the state tournament. Simon averaged three points and three rebounds per contest last season.

The Irish outscored opponents 53-41 and shot 44% from the floor while holding opponents to 37%.

TITAN BOYS WILL LOOK TO YOUNGSTERS FOR HELP

The HTRS Titans enter year two under Head Coach Mike Schaardt. Schaardt and assistant coach Schyler Kuhlmann will look to improve upon last year's 7-16 record. Seven of those losses came by ten points or fewer, including a three-point loss to Johnson County Central to end the 2020-21 campaign.

The Titans will lean on their three returning letter winners, Gage Schaardt, Nic Knudson and Andy Stalder. Knudson, a senior guard, has three years of starting experience and Schaardt, a senior guard/forward, has been in the lineup for the past two seasons. Knudson led HTRS with 15.9 points per game and 5.1 rebounds per contest. Schaardt averaged 11.7 points 6.9 rebounds per game and Stalder contributed 1.5 points and 3.7 rebounds per outing.

As a team, HTRS averaged 46 points per contest, 28 rebounds and ten assists each game. Coach Schaardt will also have a big freshman class at his disposal this winter. Freshman will include Brennan Vaughn Brogan Dunlap, Kiffen Hunzeker and Hunter Bohling, among others. Sophomores looking for time will consist of JJ McQueen, Alex Koziol and Colt McKlarnen.

Gone from last season's squad are Donovan Kostecka, Jayden McNeely, Trevor Plager and Jacob Joy.

The Titans will use a mix of strong play on the perimeter, coupled with good shooting and a solid inside game. Defensively, HTRS hopes to be aggressive yet disciplined.

'We will be a young team," said Coach Schaardt. "Team speed will hopefully be faster. Bench depth will be better than in the past years. We want to improve on last year's record and individually as players to make us a better team. I expect the younger kids to be ready to contribute to the team.'

According to Coach Schaardt, Nebraska City Lourdes will be a good test early in the season. Falls City Sacred Heart is a team the Titans always want to play well against, Freeman will always be solid, and the Pioneer Conference and MUDECAS field will also provide intense competition.

The Titans will open the season with a home contest versus the Diller-Odell Griffins on Friday, December 3, at 7:30 p.m. Last year, the Griffins got the best of the Titans on opening night with a seven-point win, 45-38.

WITH EXPERIENCE BACK, LADY TIGERS READY TO ROAR

The Falls City Lady Tigers look to make a jump in year number two under Head Coach Andy Armbruster. Last winter, Armbruster took over the reins from former Coach Max Milam. The Tigers fought to a 9-13 record last season, falling in five of their final six contests. With a year under their belts in the new system, the Tigers look to continue to climb in the win column.

Coach Armbruster will be joined on the bench again this season by Allison Haines and John Furrow.

The Tigers will have an abundance of experience coming back this season, returning eight letter winners from a season ago. Armbruster made it known that it won't be easy to replace Eryn Snethen from last year's team. Snethen averaged over nine points per game and led the team with 21 three-pointers made. Snethen also finished with 83 rebounds and 34 steals.

Falls City will likely go with Reece McNeely, a junior, at forward. Madi Jones, another junior at forward. Ava Armbruster, a sophomore, will run the point. Ashleigh Kirkendall, a sophomore, will play guard and McKinely Scholl, a sophomore, will play the guard/forward position. Armbruster was quick to comment that he would call upon Chase Nolte, Elyse Poppe and Emily Vitosh for essential minutes throughout the season.

Jones averaged eight points per game, pulled down 115 rebounds, dished out 33 assists and had 44 steals.

Kirkendall scored seven points per contest, secured 80 rebounds, had 32 assists and 33 steals.

McNeely scored four points per game, fought for 77 boards, passed off 32 assists and swiped the ball 31 times.

At the point, Armbruster averaged just three points per game but has a team-high 45 assists to go along with 54 rebounds and 43 steals.

Finally, Scholl scored two points per contest, pulled down 49 boards, had 21 assists and blocked six shots.

Coach Armbruster said some of the games were lost late in the contest last season.

"Lots of returning players-looking to finish close games with wins, to compete in the conference and hope to be playing our best ball at the end of the season. Hope to compete for a district championship," said Armbruster.

Falls City will open the year against a formidable foe in the Syracuse Rockets on Friday, December 3, in Syracuse at 6:00 p.m. The Rockets, a likely Class C1 contender, finished last season 21-4 and ended the Tigers season in sub-districts 48-24.

IRISH WORKING TOWARDS TITLE NUMBER SIX

The Falls City Sacred Heart Irish girls' basketball team finished third in 2020, defeating Mullen 59-36 in the consolation game. Last season, the Irish fell to Humphrey St. Francis 57-48 in the title game, playing without starter Rachel Magdanz. This year, the Irish have one goal in mind, a state championship. The Lady Irish have won six titles, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2015, 2017 and 2018.

Coach Luke Santo enters his 16th season in charge of the Irish, sporting a 365-52 record. Sacred Heart finished last season with a 26-3 record, losing by two to Lourdes Central, by three to Weeping Water and by nine in the finals to the Flyers. The Irish did take home the crown at the MUDECAS Tourney and finished runner-up in the Pioneer Conference Tournament.

Santo expects his team to be athletic enough to play fast and score points in transition.

"We will play mostly man to man on defense, we may use a full-court press when necessary, or we may mix in some zone," said Santo. "It sounds simple, but we just need to play to our potential and up to our ability. We have to get the most out of every player on our team."

This winter, the Lady Irish will have high expectations, returning four starters and eight letter winners from last year's runner-up squad.

Back on the court are all-staters Erison Vonderschmdit and Rachel Magdanz. Vonderschmidt led the Irish, scoring 16 points and pulling in seven rebounds per contest. Magdanz averaged ten points per game and dished out 108 assists. Magdanz suffered a terrible ankle injury versus Wynot in the semi-finals last spring, causing her to miss track season and all of the summer workouts. Olivia Eickhoff, a 5'7 guard, scored 172 points last season and added 70 rebounds and Jessica Wertenberger, a 5'9 forward, scored 178 points and pulled in 94 rebounds. Seniors Emma Littrel (114 rebounds) and Lauren Malone (56 assists) will provide solid minutes for the Irish, as will DeLanie Witt, Macy Keller and London Nachtigal.


"Expectations are going to be very high for our girls this year," said Santo. "We only lost Danielle Bippes, so we have a ton of experience and talent coming back. Our girls have to understand that it doesn't guarantee us anything. It just gives us a really good opportunity to have a special year. As always, our biggest goal is to be playing our best basketball when it matters most. With this being the last run for our seniors, and after what happened last year and being so close, we should have a very determined team this year."

The Irish will host the Sterling Jets on Friday, December 3, to open the 2021-22 campaign.





the Sterling Jets.



LADY TITANS READY TO JUMP INTO SEASON

The HTRS Titan girls' basketball team is ready to get the season off and running. Head Coach Karmen Tomek enters her third season as the play-caller for the Titans with a 25-23 record. Assisting Coach Tomek on the sidelines for her second season will be Macie Coffey.

The Titans finished the 2020-21 season one game under .500 at 11-12. With nine letter winners returning, the 2021-22 squad looks to leap forward.

"We're really excited with the underclassmen we are pulling into our program. We have a few sophomores and freshmen that will make a big difference for us this year," said Coach Tomek.

The Titans were close to a winning season last year as three of the 12 losses came by six points or fewer. Unfortunately for the Titans, a slow start out of the gate doomed the season before it really got started. HTRS dropped seven of the season's first eight games, putting themselves in a hole they couldn't climb out of.

The Titans pulled themselves out of their spiral, putting together a good run in the middle of January last year, winning a season-high four consecutive contests and seven out of eight.

The Titans have proven they have what it takes to get big wins, taking first in the 2019-20 MUDECAS B Division tourney in Beatrice.
