

## TIGERS UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP FOR FIRST TIME IN 23 SEASONS

The Falls City Tiger boys' basketball team will be under new direction this winter for the first time in over two decades. Coach Don Hogue hung up his clipboard after 23 years and 296 wins with Falls City. In his place will be first-year Head Coach Patrick Miller. Last year, Coach Miller, a Pawnee City High School graduate, served as the boys' basketball coach at Smith Center, Ks.

Jaxson Balm and Brandon Gibson will assist Coach Miller; both are first-year assistants with the Tiger high school team.

Last winter, Falls City had a down season, wrapping up the 2021-22 with a 6-16 mark. FC opened the 2021-22 year with a six-game losing streak before defeating Sterling in the Weeping Water Holiday Tourney to get the first win of the season. The Tigers had a season-best two-game winning streak to wrap up the regular season, defeating HTRS 56-40 and Fairbury 65-49. Unfortunately for the Tigers, Fairbury got revenge in sub-districts, beating FC 45-55.

Under the new head coach, Falls City will look to run a free-flowing offense while trying to protect the basket on defense with more of a pack-line mentality. Falls City returns three letter winners with Jaxyn Strauss, Bryson Butrick and Jon Craig. Coach Miller will also look to Alijah Hernandez, Cayden Dunkhas and Charlie McNeely for meaningful minutes throughout the season.

Last winter, Strauss led the Tigers with 266 points, averaging 12.7 points per contest and 104 rebounds. Craig scored 181 points for an 8.2 ppg average while pulling down team-best 114 rebounds. Butrick led the playmaking for FC last year with 61 assists.

Coach Miller's outlook for the season is five-fold. First, Miller "hopes to meet the stan dards of our program through our core values of servanthood, gratitude, humility, passion and unity." Miller also hopes to achieve academic success, to compete in every aspect of basketball, to play simple, solid and sound basketball and "to give 87% every day, looking for ways to become better"-- Dick DeVenzio.

Falls City opened the season at home against Syracuse on Friday, December 2, 2022. Last year the Rockets got the best of the Tigers in the opener, 34-46. The Tigers will be at home again on Friday, December 9, when they host the Johnson-Brock Eagles. The Eagles shut down FC last December, 21-67. FC will play in the Weeping Water Holiday

# Irish poised for another postseason run

Expectations are always high for Coach Doug Goltz and the Sacred Heart Irish boys' basketball team; the 2022-23 season will be no different. The Irish are coming off a 24-6 season and a third place finish at the NSAA state tournament. Sacred Heart fell to Parkview Christian in the semi-finals last spring but bounced back to take down Osceola, 63-40, in the third-place contest at Lincoln East High School.

Head Coach Doug Goltz, the all-time leader in Nebraska boys' basketball, enters the season with a career record of 718 wins against only 189 losses. Assisting Coach Goltz on the bench will be Brian Lemerond. During his 36 years in charge of the Irish, Goltz's teams have amassed 11 state championships, the most recent coming in the 2020-21 season.

Sacred Heart graduated four seniors from last year's squad and they will all be missed. Gone are Jakob Jordan, Brogan Nachtigal, Jake Froeschl and Derek Schawang. Jordan led the team with 12 points per game and 121 assists. Nachtigal added 11 points per game and 168 rebounds. Froeschl scored seven points per game, pulled down 101 rebounds and added 56 steals. Schawang finished with 65 rebounds and four blocked shots.

Coach Goltz does have the benefit of returning six letter winners, including two starters. Evan Keithley, a 6'1 guard, set a school record for most made three-pointers in a season, making 66 of 174 attempts. Joe Simon, a 6'3 forward, averaged eight points and six rebounds per game while finishing with a team-high 28 blocked shots.

The Irish will look at seniors Sam Dunn and Riley Nelson and juniors Jack Stice and James Froeschl to complete the rotation.

On the offensive end of the court, Coach Goltz hopes to have a balanced attack, not relying on just one or two players for points. Defensively, the Irish will pressure the ball, but they may mix in a little more zone defense due to the lack of depth.

The Irish will face a lot of stiff competition this winter, playing the likes of Auburn, Johnson-Brock, LeBlond, Tri County, the Freeman Holiday Tourney, the MUDECAS Tourney and the Pioneer Conference Tournament.

"We can be a contending D2 team if we work hard, avoid injuries and improve during the season," said Goltz. "We lost some very good seniors but return some very talented players."

The Irish opened the season on Friday, December 2, at Sterling. Last year, the Irish opened with a 74-29 win over the Jets in Falls City. The Irish will play in the Freeman Holiday Tourney on December 29 and 30, the MUDECAS Tourney in Beatrice from January 9 to January 14 and the Pioneer Conference Tourney from January 30 to February 4, 2023.



## **TITANS WILL LEAN ON YOUTH FOR** 2022-23

The HTRS Titan boys' basketball team enters the third season under Coach Mike Schaardt. Last winter, the Titans finished the season just under the .500 mark, finishing at 12-15. In his two seasons in charge of HTRS, Schaardt is 19-31. First-year assistant coach Heath Finke will assist Schaardt this winter.

Coach Schaardt will have to replace the bulk of his offense from a season ago. Gone are Nic Knudson (17.2 ppg), Gage Schaardt (11.5 ppg), Andy Stalder (5.3 ppg), Hunter Frey (2.2 ppg.) Knudson finished with a team-best 62 steals and 53 assists. Schaardt had a team-high 183 rebounds, 25 blocked shots and 51 assists. Stalder hauled in 151 rebounds and 50 assists. Jack Hunzeker is the lone returning starter for the Titans this winter. A year ago, Hunzeker scored 153 points last season to average 5.6 points per game. Hunzeker added 41 rebounds, 21 steals and 36 assists.

"I will be looking for four new starters so that it could be a learning curve offensively," said Coach Schaardt. "Should have good speed, but there will be speed bumps on the offensive end." On the defensive end of the hardwood, look for the Titans to run a high-pressure, man-to-man. HTRS will make the opposition play full-court offense for all four quarters.

Schaardt will lean on sophomores Hunter Bohling and Brogan Dunlap, juniors J.J. McQueen, Alex Koziol and Arthur Penisson and seniors Ryken Davis and Brandt Leech.

Coach Schaardt said his first order of business would be to get six to eight guys to blend and play together as a team.

"I know my guys will be able to step up and fill the shoes from last year's senior class. They have good work ethic, so that will help get us going early," said Schaardt.

Last winter, the Titans placed third in the "B" division of the MUDECAS tourney in Beatrice, placed second at the Weeping Water Holiday Tourney and were the runner-up in sub-districts. HTRS had its season end in the sub-district final, falling to Lourdes Central 52-31. The Titans defeated McCool Junction in the sub-district opener 52-37 and then upset the top seed Johnson-Brock 55-48.



## EXPERIENCED LADY TIGERS READY FOR HOOPS SEASON

Falls City Lady Tiger head coach Andy Armbruster welcomes back four starters for the 2022-23 basketball season and he has high expectations for this group. Returning starters for the Lady Tigers will be a pair of seniors in Madi Jones and Reece McNeely; both forwards have three years of starting experience under their belts. Last winter Jones scored 268 points, had 50 steals, 103 rebounds and converted 61/124 free throw attempts. McNeely secured 86 rebounds last season while scoring 73 points.

Two juniors are also back on the hardwood for coach Armbruster. Ashley Kirkendall, a two-year starter at guard/forward and Ava Armbruster, a two-year starting guard, will add to the experience on the court this winter. Kirkendall led Falls City with 12 three-pointers, scored 130 points, added 87 rebounds and had 32 steals. Armbruster will handle the play-calling role on the court for FC. Last season, Ava dished out 72 assists, pulled down 61 rebounds, had 40 steals and averaged over four points per contest.

Coach Armbruster will have some depth to draw from this winter as he looks for seniors Elyse Poppe and Hannah Collier to log essential minutes on the court, as well as junior Emily Vitosh and sophomore Isabelle Armbruster.


Gone from last winter's team are Chase Nolte and Makinley Scholl. Nolte scored 143, had 117 rebounds and 11 blocked shots and Scholl added 167 points, 87 rebounds, 80 assists and 57 and 57 steals.

"We have four seniors and two juniors returning with varsity experience," said Coach Armbruster. "This is as experienced of a team as I have worked with. Their leadership will be a determining factor in this season's success. We will be undersized most nights, but with improved shooting and aggressive defense, we should be competitive."


Armbruster enters his third season in charge of the Lady Tigers and is 23-23 overall with a 14-10 2021-22 campaign. Assisting Armbruster will be Josh McCampbell who is moving over from the boy's bench.

Offensively, Falls City will look to be more aggressive on the offensive end, driving to the bucket more and looking to take advantage of some open looks from

## LADY IRISH LOOKING TO REMAIN ON TOP

The defending Class D2 state champs will have plenty of new faces on the court this winter, but don't count out the Irish as they head into the 2022-23 season.

Head Coach Luke Santo enters his 17th season in charge of the Lady Irish program. During his stint, Santo had won four state titles and amassed an incredible 392-55 record. Santo's teams have also finished runner-up three times at the state tourney.

Last winter, the Irish finished 27-3, winning the Freeman Holiday Tourney, the MUDECAS Tournament, the Pioneer Conference crown and the program's seventh state championship. The Irish ended the season last year on a 19-game winning streak, including a 43-33 win over the defending champion, Humphrey St. Francis.

Erison Vonderschmidt, Rachel Magdanz, Lauren Malone and Emma Littrel are gone from last season. Vonderschmidt was an All-State selection and left Sacred Heart as the school's all-time leading scorer. Magdanz was also an All-State selection and scored over 1,000 points in her career. Malone was a solid defender who finished with 50 steals and 52 assists. Littrel finished the season with 96 rebounds, 24 steals and eight blocks.

The Irish have some experience returning in Olivia Eickhoff and Jessica Wertenberger, each three-year starters.

"We'll probably be more guard-heavy than we've been in the past," said Santo. "So we need to develop some outside shooting. With all the guards we have coming back, we should have multiple ball handlers on the floor at all times, so that should help keep turnovers down and help against pressing teams." Santo will also lean on seniors DeLanie Witt and Macy Keller and junior Makinley Scholl. Witt scored 153 points last year, Keller added 48 points and 52 rebounds and Scholl scored 167 points and pulled down 87 rebounds at Falls City High School last winter.

The Lady Irish hope to pick up where they left off last winter. SH lost their three games last winter by a total of 17 points, including a two-point loss to Bishop LeBlond.

"We had a great class graduate, but we return two all-state type players in Olivia Eickhoff and Jessica Wertenberger, along with some other girls that have some big-game experience, so we feel like we have the talent to build around," said Santo.

The Irish will be ready for all-comers as they look to retain their state championship.


"We had a great summer against some great competition," said Santo. "During the summer, we try to play bigger schools, tough competition and schools that we don't normally see. We won the Miss Basketball tournament in Kearney and our summer league in Sabet ha. Hopefully, through practice and some of our early games, we will get girls settled into their new roles, get some key game experience, gain some confidence throughout December, and have things figured out by the new year. We don't feel like expectations should drop because of who we graduated."

beyond the arc. Defensively, FC will try to get their opponents to turn the ball over by playing aggressive, man-to-man defense. Armbruster hopes the pressure defense will cause more deflections, leading to steals and fewer opportunities on offense by their foes.

The Tigers will be looking to play well all season, but games against Syracuse, Auburn and a chance to defend their championship at the Fairfax Tourney will be high on the Lady Tigers' list. At the end of the season, coach Armbruster hopes Falls City will be competing for both a conference and district title.

FC opens the 2022-23 campaign with a home contest against the Syracuse Rockets on Friday, December 2, 2022. The Tigers will get Johnson-Brock and Freeman at home on Friday, December 9, and Saturday, December 10. Last winter, FC fell to Syracuse 23-56 and Johnson-Brock, 42-45 in overtime.








## UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP, LADY TITANS READY FOR 2022-23 CAMPAIGN

The Lady Titans have a new head coach for the winter season as Schuyler Kuhlmann takes over for Karmen Tomek as the HTRS basketball coach. In three years with the Titans, Tomek wrapped up her coaching duties with an overall 31-41 record. Assisting Coach Kuhlmann will be Todd Dierberger (second year) and Brittany Rogge (first year.)

Redirecting the Titan program won't be easy for Kuhlmann as his team will replace six seniors who were contributors last winter. Gone from the 2021-22 team are Jacey Leech, a third-team All-Conference post player and Ellie Schaardt, an All-Conference honorable mention selection at guard. Leech was important on both sides of the ball and Schaardt was a great ball handler for the squad. The Titans will also miss Gracie Shafer, Aly Howe and Saydee Hardesty.

"We're going to be a small team," said Coach Kuhlmann. "So, we want to push the ball when we can. We also have a few good outside shooters that we hope will get going to give us more opportunities to get to the rim."

On the defensive end of the court, HTRS will try to speed teams up and force turnovers.

"We're going to try a few different looks to see what works best for us as things move forward," said Kuhlmann.

Sophomore Laramie Glathar and junior Jaylie McNealy will bring some experience to the table this winter for the Titans.

"Laramie will be looked at to do a lot of things for us," said Coach Kuhlmann. "She's a good ball handler, but also can work and score down low. Jaylie is primarily a guard. She is a good shooter and she'll be looked at to be one of our leaders this year."

The Titans will also seek contributions from seniors Ashton Bredemeier, Jaylyn Bohling, and junior Avery Dierberger.





When talking about Andy, Coach Maloley said, "last year, he was 42-11 at 170; he will be wrestling 195-220 and should reach his 100th win."


Both wrestlers have the potential to be on the mats at the CHI Health Center in February, competing for a state medal.

According to coach Kraft, Falls City will have a great group of kids with a lot of mat experience.


"We have the largest group of freshmen we've had in quite a few years," said Kraft. "All that had very successful middle school careers."
